EDUCATION


2019 saw an exciting programme of well-attended courses including our **Humble Heritage** series that provided hands-on training with traditional materials.

The Philip Webb Award celebrated sustainability this year with joint first prize going to **Olivia Hellman** for her urban dairy scheme in Stoke on Trent, and to **Nikola Yanev** receiving the award for his scheme to turn a disused textile mill into an algae energy production plant in Halifax.

The John Betjeman Award went to **St Oswald's Church**, **Grasmere, Cumbria** for church tower repairs, carried out by Crosby Granger Architects. We also invited applications for a **Millwright Fellow** with funds from the Edith Lamb Legacy.

We held **27** courses, lectures and workshops and welcomed **796** delegates

Four Scholars and four Fellows travelled to **214** workshops, sites or buildings between them during the Scholarship and Fellowship programme.



CAMPAIGNING

IN 2019 we renewed our focus on buildings at risk, built a network of expert volunteers to carry out casework visits and put our approach into practice at sites across the UK. SPAB Scotland and SPAB Ireland held exemplary working parties repairing a lime kiln in Lismore, Oban, and the Tullynisk House buildings in Co. Offaly.

This year we responded to almost **1000 requests** for advice on proposed changes to listed buildings.

Reordering at St John the Baptist, Bodicote, Oxfordshire The church took our advice against lifting their beautiful historic floors to create level access an install underfloor heating. We offered solutions that met their access, flexible space and heating needs so the character of this 13th century gem can still be enjoyed.



We strengthened our international connections in 2019, meeting with conservation professionals interested in craft training from Latvia, Lithuania, Australia and New Zealand.

In October 2019 we hosted an early-career architect from India, keen to learn more about our conservation principles and practice. We took our advice on the road with our first advice surgery at Thaxted Guildhall in Essex.
